PAST ACTION

LCTC staff have completed the Draft Lassen County 2023 Regional Transportation Plan and Initial Study Checklist/Proposed Negative Declaration. These documents will be available for review from October 6 - November 6.

BACKGROUND/DISCUSSION

One of the major planning responsibilities of the LCTC is the development of the Regional Transportation Plan (RTP). The RTP serves as the planning blueprint to guide transportation investments in Lassen County involving local, state, and federal funding over the next twenty years. Transportation improvements in the RTP are identified as short-range/constrained (2023-2033) or long-range/unconstrained (2034-2044). The RTP must be updated every five (5) years to comply with Caltrans guidelines and be eligible for many sources of funding. The last RTP update was adopted in 2017. Any transportation capital improvement projects funded with state or federal funds must be identified in the RTP.

The overall focus of the 2023 RTP is directed at developing a coordinated and balanced multi-modal regional transportation system that is financially constrained to the revenues anticipated over the life of the plan. The coordination focus brings the County, Caltrans, the City of Susanville, government resource agencies, commercial and agricultural interests, Susanville Indian Rancheria, and citizens into the planning process. The balance is achieved by considering investment and improvements for moving people and goods across all types of transportation including automobiles, public transit, bicycle, pedestrian, trucking, railroad, and aviation.

This 2023 update of the RTP did not significantly change the scope or goals of the prior RTP. As required by Caltrans, staff followed the 2017 RTP Guidelines in updating this document. As required by the guidelines, the plan incorporates the following elements: Modal Discussion, Policy Element, Action Element and Financial Element.

The first section of the document updates demographic and economic conditions in Lassen County including population projections. The next section reviews relevant planning documents which were reviewed as part of the process and incorporated as relevant. The Modal Discussion describes the capital facilities for each transportation mode along with regional transportation issues and needs for each mode. Minor changes to the Policy Element were made to reference current projects and emphasize the need to maintain a regional transportation system which is resilient to extreme weather and related events. The Action Element is where are transportation capital improvements to meet the needs of the Lassen County regional transportation network are listed. Projects are separated by jurisdiction/implementing agency, transportation facility type and short-term/long-term. Costs are estimated for most projects and potential funding sources are identified. The Financial Element projects recurring transportation revenue for the 20 year planning period. Over the next five years, LCTC has identified a financially constrained regional transportation plan. However, beyond this time period, there is at least a \$32 million deficit in funding to implement all the project needed to improve and maintain the regional transportation system.

A robust stakeholder and community participation effort was undertaken to gain input on needs and issues with respect to transportation in Lassen County and the City of Susanville. First a wide range of transportation-related stakeholders were contacted for input. This included, Bureau of Land Management, California Fish and Wildlife, US National Forest, Air Pollution Control District, Water Quality Control Board, Native American Tribes and Lassen Land and Trails Trust. An on-line community survey was distributed as part of the Active Transportation Plan update process which asked respondents to identify capital improvements they would like to see in the region. This input was also relevant to the RTP update. A virtual public workshop was held this summer which described the RTP process and asked for input on transportation needs. A pop-up workshop was also held at the Lassen Rural Bus booth at the farmer's market in Susanville.

According to the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA), an RTP is considered a "project" and therefore must undergo environmental review. Consistent with prior RTP updates an Initial Study checklist was prepared and a Negative Declaration is proposed. According to staff review, adoption of this RTP does not equal project implementation. The RTP is a visionary programmatic document. Each project listed in the RTP will undergo separate environmental review. Additionally, the RTP contains projects and goals which will reduce the impact on the environment. Therefore, the RTP will not have a significant impact on the environment.

RECOMMENDATION – Review the RTP (more specifically the Action Element) and provide staff with suggestions and input by November 6.



2024 State Transportation Improvement Program Update

REQUESTED ACTION

Provide direction to staff regarding regional priorities on projects for inclusion in the 2024 State Transportation Improvement Program on behalf of Lassen County and the City of Susanville.

BACKGROUND

The State Transportation Improvement Program (STIP) is a five-year capital improvement program of transportation projects on and off the State Highway System, funded with revenue from the State Highway Account and other funding sources (most notably SB1). STIP programming generally occurs every two years. The programming cycle begins with the release of a proposed fund estimate in July of odd-numbered years, followed by California Transportation Commission (CTC) adoption of the fund estimate in August (odd years). The fund estimate serves to identify the amount of new funds available for the programming of transportation projects.

Once the fund estimate is adopted, Caltrans and the regional planning agencies (the LCTC) prepare transportation improvement plans for submittal by December 15th (odd years). Caltrans prepares the Interregional Transportation Improvement Plan (ITIP) and regional agencies prepare Regional Transportation Improvement Plans (RTIP's). CTC public hearings are held in January (even years) in both northern and southern California. The STIP is adopted by the CTC by April (even years).

Local agencies work through their Regional Transportation Planning Agency (RTPA), County Transportation Commission, or Metropolitan Planning Organization (MPO), as appropriate, to nominate projects for inclusion in the STIP. In our case the Lassen County Transportation Commission (LCTC) is responsible for working with the City of Susanville, Lassen County, and the Susanville Indian Rancheria, to identify and nominate a list of projects for inclusion in the Lassen County RTIP.

Once projects are programmed, agencies may begin the project implementation process. It is important to note that there are timely use of funds rules associated with STIP projects that are established by statute and outlined in both the STIP Guidelines adopted by the CTC and Chapter 23 of the Local Assistance Program Guidelines.

Locally, the RTIP can include capital projects associated with the state highway system. The Gateway project associated with US 395 is an example of this type of project, as well as capital overlay projects on local streets and roads. Any project that is nominated through the RTIP/STIP process must be consistent with the Lassen County Regional Transportation Plan.

DISCUSSION

Since the summer Commission staff has conferred with City of Susanville, Lassen County, and Caltrans staff to determine the best mix of projects to be included in the 2024 STIP. This has included detailed reevaluation of projects being carried over from the 2022 STIP, and potential new projects to be nominated as part of the 2024 cycle. It also takes into consideration actions to amend projects in the 2022 STIP to address cost increases and scope re-evaluation. These actions include:

- The Southeast Gateway Project being moved to construction year 2023-24 (excluding the new sign)
- Budget augmentation to County Rehab D (PPNO 02-2600) Standish Road (County Road 301), US 395 to Honey Girl Road
- Budget Augmentation to County Rehab E (PPNO 02-2601) Standish Road (County Road 301), Mapes Lane to US 395
- Non-STIP budget augmentation to Riverside Drive Class 1 Bike Ped Project (PPNO 02-2480) received construction funding from the Active Transportation Program and the Clean California program. Construction is scheduled for the summer of 2024.

In addition the Janesville Main Street Bike/Ped project (PPNO 02-2261) after evaluation by Lassen County public works staff, and public input, will be deleted from the STIP. The funds (\$40,000) will be returned to Lassen County's STIP share for this cycle.

Both County projects Rehab C and Rehab B, and City of Susanville project City Street Rehab FD (PPNO 02-2561) were finished during the 2021 construction year.

Available STIP Revenue

The current fund estimate for the 2024 STIP for Lassen County is approximately \$6,550,000 (\$2,564,000 in unprogrammed carryover, and \$4,053,000 of new programmable capacity).

2024 STIP Proposal

The 2024 Regional Transportation Improvement Program which you will be asked to adopt at your November 13, 2023 Regular meeting will contain detailed information on all projects being considered below. However, the fundamental proposals you are being asked to move forward are as follows:

Projects Carried Over from the 2022 RTIP

- Beaver Creek Bridge Replacement (PPNO 2562) -- Near the town of Bieber on Pittville Road over Beaver Creek
- Southeast Gateway Project (PPNO 3492) -- In the City of Susanville on State Route 36
 - Construct curb gutter and sidewalk
 - ADA compliant ramps
 - Widen shoulders
 - Safety lighting
 - Landscaping and irrigation
- Riverside Trail Drive (PPNO 2480) Build class 1 bike path and bridge
- County Rehab D (PPNO 2600)

 Standish Road, Mapes Lane to US 395 North. Rehabilitate roadway
- County Rehab E (PPNO 2601) Standish Road, US 395 to Honey Girl Road East. Rehabilitate roadway
- Planning, Programming & Monitoring (PPNO 02-2124) Used primarily for staff to fund development of new projects, planning and other transportation work as needed.

Potential New Projects/Actions

Lassen County

- 1. Rehab D* in current STIP is underfunded (approximately \$465,000) due to revised estimate based on very recent bidding for same type of work. Project Limits- A-3 from US-395 to Honey Girl Lane. A-3 from McBarron Lane to Mapes Line. Cost approximately \$2,015,000. (3.1 mi)
- 2. Rehab E* in current STIP is underfunded (approximately \$465,000) due to revised estimate based on very recent bidding for same type of work. Project Limits- A-3 from US-395 to Mapes Lane. Cost approximately \$2,015,000. (3.1 mi)
- 3. New Project Rehab F: Rehab section of A1 from Hwy 139 to MP 5 (5mi), cost 3.217mm Note: The County has been shortlisted for a Federal Lands Access Program (FLAP) project on the Hwy 36 end of A1 so that may impact the ultimate programming of this project. Estimated cost is \$3,200,000.
- 4. Beaver Creek Bridge Project STIP funding match in the amount of \$250,000

*The County is requesting that Projects D and E be combined for construction in 2024. Estimate of the cost of the combined projected at \$3,100,000.

City of Susanville

- 1. Rehabilitation project FE Approximate cost \$2,600,000 Estimated construction year 2025 (TBD)
 - a. South Lassen Cypress to Susan River
 - b. Alexander Riverside to Sierra
 - c. Russell Main to 200 feet south of Bunyan

- d. Fair Drive Main to Russell
- e. Johnstonville Skyline to Riverside
- f. Paiute Skyline to Glenn

LCTC

Continued allocation of Planning Programming and Monitoring funds through the end of the 2024 STIP planning horizon.

NEXT STEPS

Staff will finalize cost and scheduling for each proposed projects and include it into the draft 2024 RTIP for adoption at your November 13 Regular Meeting.

ALTERNATIVES

Direct staff to consider an alternative list of projects.
