- More personalized messaging to drivers the names of those involved in accidents on the highway due to reckless driving
- Reminders to slow down and use passing lanes only
- Increased CHP presence and enforcement
- Using CMS and Radio messaging to remind drivers
- More frequent passing lanes

## 4.11 2026 State Transportation Improvement Program \*

The Commission was provided background on the 2026 State Transportation Improvement Program (STIP). The STIP is a five-year capital improvement program of transportation projects on and off the State Highway System, funded with revenue from the State Highway Account and other funding sources (most notably SB1). STIP programming generally occurs every two years. The programming cycle begins with the release of a proposed fund estimate In July of odd-numbered years, followed by California Transportation Commission (CTC) adoption of the fund estimate in August (odd years). The fund estimate serves to identify the among of new funds available for the programming of local transportation projects.

Staff indicated that they would described some of the projects that have been funded through the STIP. They also provided a timeline for when the proposed new projects would be made available for review and approval by the Commission. He indicated that he would be working with County, City and Tribal staff to identify projects for them to consider.

This was a discussion/information item and no action was taken.

## 4.12 Fiscal Year 2025/26 Overall Work Program and Budget Amendment #1

The Commission was asked, by motion, Adopt Resolution 25-10 approving Amendment #1 to the Fiscal Year 2025/26 Overall Work Program and Budget (OWP).

Staff reminded the commission that they had adopted the FY25/26 OWP at their June 23, 2025, Regular Meeting. Since then, there have been several developments that required an amendment to the FY 25/26 OWP. Primarily the LCTC received notice from Caltrans that they had received two Sustainable Transportation Planning Grants, necessitating an amendment to the recently approved OWP. The two grants will be included in the OWP as:

- WE 607 Lassen County Electric Vehicle Charging Master Plan
- WE 608 Bizz Johnson Rail Trail Extension Feasibility Study In addition, carryover grant funds (approximately \$15,000) will be added to the Lassen County GIS effort as discussed at the June 23, 2025 Regular Meeting.

There was discussion about the nature of the two grants, their purpose and when they would be implemented.

## 4.13 Volcanic Scenic Highway - Contract for Highway Assessment - Second Phase \*

Staff reminded the Commissioners that over the last two years LCTC in partnership with the Volcanic Legacy Community Partnership (VLCP), have been exploring ways to develop a plan to increase the economic contribution of the Volcanic Legacy Scenic Byway All American Road to underserved communities. The plan would seek to improve any conditions along the Byway which have deteriorated as a result of recent fires, other calamities and age. This second, and more extensive effort, would bring the plan to completion.

## REQUESTED ACTION

Provide direction to staff regarding regional priorities on projects for inclusion in the 2026 State Transportation Improvement Program on behalf of Lassen County and the City of Susanville.

## BACKGROUND

The State Transportation Improvement Program (STIP) is a five-year capital improvement program of transportation projects on and off the State Highway System, funded with revenue from the State Highway Account and other funding sources (most notably SB1). STIP programming generally occurs every two years. The programming cycle begins with the release of a proposed fund estimate in July of odd-numbered years, followed by California Transportation Commission (CTC) adoption of the fund estimate in August (odd years). The fund estimate serves to identify the amount of new funds available for the programming of transportation projects.

Once the fund estimate is adopted, Caltrans and the regional planning agencies (the LCTC) prepare transportation improvement plans for submittal by December 15th (odd years). Caltrans prepares the Interregional Transportation Improvement Plan (ITIP) and regional agencies prepare Regional Transportation Improvement Plans (RTIP's). CTC public hearings are held in January (even years) in both northern and southern California. The STIP is adopted by the CTC by April (even years).

Local agencies work through their Regional Transportation Planning Agency (RTPA), County Transportation Commission, or Metropolitan Planning Organization (MPO), as appropriate, to nominate projects for inclusion in the STIP. In our case the Lassen County Transportation Commission (LCTC) is responsible for working with the City of Susanville, Lassen County, and the Susanville Indian Rancheria, to identify and nominate a list of projects for inclusion in the Lassen County RTIP.

Once projects are programmed, agencies may begin the project implementation process. It is important to note that there are timely use of funds rules associated with STIP projects that are established by statute and outlined in both the STIP Guidelines adopted by the CTC and Chapter 23 of the Local Assistance Program Guidelines.

Locally, the RTIP can include capital projects associated with the state highway system. The Gateway project associated with US 395 is an example of this type of project, as well as capital overlay projects on local streets and roads. Any project that is nominated through the RTIP/STIP process must be consistent with the Lassen County Regional Transportation Plan.

## DISCUSSION

Since the summer Commission staff has conferred with City of Susanville, Lassen County, and Caltrans staff to determine the best mix of projects to be included in the 2026 STIP. This has included detailed re-evaluation of projects being carried over from the 2024 STIP, and potential new projects to be nominated as part of the 2026 cycle. It also takes into consideration actions to amend projects in the 2024 STIP to address cost increases and scope re-evaluation. These actions include:

• An additional \$100,000 allocated by the CTC (6/25) to the City of Susanville's Rehabilitation FE – Estimated construction year 2026

## Available STIP Revenue

The current fund estimate for the 2026 STIP for Lassen County is approximately \$4,689,000 (\$1,942,000 in unprogrammed carryover, and \$2,747,000 of new programmable capacity).

## 2024 STIP Proposal

The 2026 Regional Transportation Improvement Program which you will be asked to adopt at your November 10, 2025 Regular meeting will contain detailed information on all projects being considered below. However, the fundamental proposals you are being asked to move forward are as follows:

Projects Carried Over from the 2024 RTIP or that will be completed in 2026

- Beaver Creek Bridge Replacement (PPNO 2562) -- Near the town of Bieber on Pittville Road over Beaver Creek
- Rehabilitation project FE (PPNO 2653) Various Roads South Lassen, Alexander, Russell, Fair Drive, Johnstonville, Paiute
- Planning, Programming & Monitoring (PPNO 02-2124) Used primarily for staff to fund development of new projects, planning and other transportation work as needed.

Projects that will be completed in 2026

• Riverside Trail Drive (PPNO 2480) – Build class 1 bike path and bridge

- County Rehab D (PPNO 2600)— Standish Road, Mapes Lane to US 395 North. Rehabilitate roadway
- County Rehab E (PPNO 2601) Standish Road, US 395 to Honey Girl Road East. Rehabilitate roadway
- County Rehab F (PPNO 2652) Section of A1 from Hwy 139 to MP 5 (5mi)
